Other Signal Words

Pronouns. Use pronouns which refer to words in preceding sentences.

I handed a pencil to Terry, the boy who sits behind me in math class. He had forgotten to bring one and was desperate because a test had been announced.

Demonstrative Adjectives (this, that, those, these, such) which refer to earlier words or ideas.

Bell Robinson has always been shy. This shyness kept her from enjoying the party.

Repeat Words or ideas used in the preceding sentence.

"But, in a larger sense, we cannot dedicate--we cannot consecrate--we cannot consecrate--we cannot hallow this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far beyond our poor power to add or detract."
