Demonstrative Adjectives (this, that, those, these, such) which refer to earlier words or ideas.

Bell Robinson has always been shy. This shyness kept her from enjoying the party.

Repeat Words or ideas used in the preceding sentence.

"But, in a larger sense, we cannot dedicate--we cannot <u>consecrate</u>--we cannot <u>consecrate</u>--we cannot <u>hallow</u> this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have <u>consecrated</u> it, far beyond our poor power to add or detract." --Lincoln
